

Introduction

This Emergency Management Plan (EMP) is updated annually based on current available information. The purpose of this plan is to provide information, resources, guidance, and coordination to support actions of the authorized Emergency/Disaster Planning Agencies to save lives, minimize damage, and maintain facilities essential to the health, safety, and welfare of the older citizens of the Association of South Central Oklahoma Governments (ASCOG) Public Service Area (PSA) comprised of Caddo, Comanche, Cotton, Grady, Jefferson, McClain, Stephens and Tillman Counties of Oklahoma.

Please contact the ASCOG Area Agency on Aging (AAA) offices in Duncan Oklahoma if we have not included your agency or if we have presented incomplete information. Thank you for your continued support and for your cooperation in making this plan possible.

This document was financed in part through funds authorized under Title III of the Older Americans Act. No person is excluded from employment or participation in any program, or denied any benefit, on the basis of race, creed, color, religion, sex, national origin, age or handicap. This publication is printed and issued by ASCOG AAA. Basic Plan

I. Designated Staff Person:

AAA Emergency Coordinator Designation

- Unless otherwise designated the emergency management coordinator (EMC) for ASCOG AAA will be the current ASCOG AAA Planner.
- Ombudsman Supervisors will be emergency coordinator for any long term care facilities affected by disaster in their service area

II. Community Persons Responsible for Disaster Planning:

Community Persons responsible for Disaster Planning include: Civil Defense Directors, American Red Cross, Salvation Army, and various other interfaith agencies and Community Action Programs.

Please refer to Appendix 1 for a list of current emergency contact names and numbers. For a more exhaustive reference please refer to the ASCOG Resource Directory.

III. Coordination:

The ASCOG AAA EMC will inform disaster officials of the aging services available throughout the planning and service area and transmit resource directories, as appropriate.

IV. Written Agreements:

The ASCOG AAA EMC and the ASCOG AAA Director will negotiate written agreements with Civil Defense Directors or other appropriate officials, and outline specific coordination efforts to be carried out prior to, during, and following a disaster.

V. Considerations:

a. Types of Disasters most prevalent

- 1) Tornados
- 2) Fires
- 3) Floods
- 4) Electrical Storms – Power Outages
- 5) Ice Storms

b. Capabilities and Limitations

ASCOG AAA is not a “Front-line” or “First Responder” service provider for emergencies. Rather, the AAA is a provider of Information and Assistance Services and Resource Coordination Services. ASCOG does enter into contracts with providers of direct services including 10 AAA Grantees. Of those 10 Grantees, 3 are

Nutrition Projects that provide nutrition services to 33 nutrition centers and homebound meal providers, 4 are Independent Senior Centers that also provide Nutrition Services, 1 is an Independent Senior Center that provides health promotion activities and health screenings, 1 provider of Legal Aid Services and the Caregiver Relief Program Provider.

ASCOG takes a pre-disaster prevention approach to Emergency Management. The AAA focuses efforts on education and training for older persons and those who work to improve their lives.

ASCOG will also Coordinate and Develop Prevention Programs such as emergency stickers for windows and mailboxes, emergency health files, etc.

c. Disaster Plans and responsibility of SUOA

ASCOG AAA will coordinate efforts with the State Unit on Aging (SUOA) to ensure that ASCOG AAA Disaster Plans are conducive to the efforts outlined in SUOA policy and the SUOA Disaster Plans for the state of Oklahoma.

d. ASCOG's responsibility in non-federally declared disaster

In the event of a non-federally declared disaster, ASCOG AAA will assume greater responsibility for disaster plan implementation.

VI. SUOA review and approval of ASCOG AAA EMP

ASCOG AAA submits their annual updates for this Emergency Management Plan to the State Unit on Aging/ Aging Services Division (ASD) on an annual basis. The state agency is responsible for reviewing the EMP and approving it

VII. Annual updates of the ASCOG AAA EMP

ASCOG AAA will annually review the disaster plan and written agreements with Disaster officials for possible updating. This will be done via telephonic, electronic, and face-to-face communications with other Emergency Services providers. Written Updates may also be submitted via mail or fax.

VIII. Implementation for when Disaster is declared in ASCOG PSA

a. Determine Impact of the disaster on ASCOG facilities

Immediately following a disaster the ASCOG AAA EMC will assess if the ASCOG facilities were impacted by the disaster. If the ASCOG Main office in Duncan is not operational, the AAA EMC will go to the nearest Emergency Management Office and attempt to establish communications with Emergency Personnel. Should the Senior-Info Line be impacted the EMC will contact the telephone company to find an immediate solution. The EMC can be contacted directly in case of emergency by cell phone as listed in VII above.

b. Plan for Telephone Response by ASCOG

In responding to a disaster the EMC will contact the local Civil Defense and Red Cross, notify them of the disaster if they are not already aware of it and offer ASCOG AAA services as I&A and coordination of aging services if needed. ASCOG will provide resource directories too all officials as needed. The EMC will, with the help of the ASCOG AAA I&A Specialist, advertise these services through extensive coverage in local media if they will be needed.

In case of disaster, each AAA staff member will contact the Director to ascertain whether staff was affected by the disaster. If the designated AAA Emergency Coordinator is a disaster victim, the Director or Planner will designate another staff member to be Emergency Coordinator. The Director and Planner are responsible for initiating the Disaster Alert Phone Tree.

The EMC in coordination with the ASCOG AAA I&A Specialist will if necessary, work with grantees to provide I&A from a nutrition site or senior center within the disaster area. If necessary, ASCOG AAA will extend I&A service to a 24 hour service using ASCOG AAA and grantee personnel and staff and volunteers. If necessary, hire, train and deploy temporary supplemental staff. If necessary, apply to SUOA for more funding for staff.

c. Determine Impact on older persons in the ASCOG PSA

The ASCOG AAA EMC with the help of other AAA staff will contact appropriate disaster officials to determine the impact of the disaster on older persons in the planning and service area:

- Estimate the number of older persons affected by the disaster
- Estimate the financial impact of the disaster on older persons
- Estimate the number of older persons in immediate need of food, clothing, shelter, and other services.

d. Special needs and resources

The EMC will then, with the help of other AAA staff and service providers determine the special needs of older disaster victims and the resources available to meet those needs.

The EMC will also:

Work with AAA grantees to determine available Title III B & D funds that can be used to assist older disaster victims. Appropriate such funds if necessary. If necessary, apply to SUOA for more Title III B & D funds.

Work with AAA grantees to determine whether local senior nutrition centers should extend hours of operation and increase the number of meals served and the number of mealtimes served. If necessary, apply to SUOA for funding for extended service hours and expanded services.

Work with emergency service providers, AAA grantees and SUOA to provide relief, counseling and supportive services to staff.

Nursing Homes/Home Health Patients

Many nursing homes do not have generators. What they do, depending on how long the power goes out, is to take the residents to another facility or a temporary place like a church. Some of them have emergency plan agreements with other long-term care facilities, churches, school buses, etc. Some residents might be temporarily picked up by their relatives and taken home. The fire department or other agencies might also give them input on the best course of action given the severity of the situation.

Home health agencies and Managed Care Case Managers are responsible for contacting their patients and determining if an emergency exists and what plan of action to take.

Nursing home residents and home health patients should not be taken to the hospital unless directed by a physician or the patient's care requires in-patient status.

Staff caring for nursing home residents and home health patients who require oxygen should contact their oxygen providers to obtain oxygen canisters.

The Ombudsmen supervisor for that facility will help coordinate such efforts.

Terrorist Attack

Should a terrorist attack occur in the ASCOG AAA PSA, the EMC will contact the Emergency Manager of the county in which the attack occurred and offer Information and Referral services for Older Persons.

e. Information and Referral

The EMC will coordinate with the ASCOG AAA Information and Referral staff to provide information and make referrals to incoming inquiries, as appropriate.

f. Outreach and Transportation Services

The EMC will coordinate with I&R staff and the Title III Grantee in the ASCOG PSA to provide outreach and transportation services, as appropriate.

g. Coordination during Federally Declares Disaster

The EMC will consult with Civil Defense officials in cases of federally declared disasters to determine the need for on-site Area Agency staff assistance at disaster centers.

The Ombudsman Supervisor will:

- Assess nursing facilities in the disaster area to determine whether they have been affected by the disaster;
- Coordinate with nursing facility staff to locate resources for disaster victims within the facility;
- Coordinate with nursing facility staff to make the facility's resources available for other disaster victims; and
- Coordinate with the AAA Emergency Coordinator to keep Civil Defense and Red Cross apprised of the needs and available resources of long term care facilities in the disaster area.

Other SSD staff have two responsibilities:

- Support the activities of the Emergency Coordinator; and
- Make sure service delivery continues uninterrupted in areas not affected by the disaster.
- Identify and make referral to any other services that could help older disaster victims.
- Document each referral and report to the EMC

h. Follow-Up to elderly victims

The EMC in coordination with I&R Staff and Title III project staff will provide follow-up to elderly victims, as appropriate.

X. Written Reports to SUOA

The EMC will submit timely written reports to SUOA to inform them of the agency and project staff response to the disaster, the number of elderly impacted by the disaster, the financial impact of the disaster, services provided to the elderly during the disaster, etc.

Reports will also indicate information on all referrals, each disaster victim served, AAA staff hours used, AAA grantee staff hours used, staff and volunteer activities, and funds expended Other information requested by SUOA will be provided by the ASCOG AAA EMC.
