A total of 59 applications were received with a total request of \$2,782.313.

Sufficient REAP funds are available by the end of December to execute contracts for the first 17 projects.

Unless there are additional, unexpected cuts, the Oklahoma Department of Commerce will disburse equal monthly payments for the balance needed to fund the remaining projects in the order they appear on the list. Contracts will be executed for these projects as the money is received. No contract will be written for a project that cannot be funded due to unanticipated shortfalls in the state's budget.

The REAP program is the lifeline for rural communities to be able to address their needs represented by the listed projects. It is absolutely imperative that the legislators keep the program alive with continued funding to ensure these communities maintain a reasonable quality of life for their citizens.
