Addendum to RFP Part I, Section F:

The above mentioned plan(s) of action should be included in the service and delivery narratives of the proposal.

If no applications are received in the SFY17 request for proposals process for the above listed sites, then those sites will no longer receive funding effective July 1 and their funding will be distributed to the other sites in the planning and services area in accordance with the current allocation method.

Section F continued: Transportation

- Jefferson: Ringling and Ryan
- McClain: Blanchard, Byars, Purcell, Washington, and Wayne
- Stephens: Comanche, Duncan North, Duncan South, and Marlow
- Tillman: Frederick

<u>Incomplete proposals will not be accepted</u>. Proposals will be reviewed by staff to ensure completion prior to review by the scoring committee. Incomplete proposals will not be provided to the scoring committee. The scoring committee will be made up of ASCOG AAA Advisory Council Executive Committee members who have no conflict of interest. All requirements listed in this addendum must also be provided in order for a proposal to be considered complete.

Advisory council members will only be able to consider what is provided in the proposal in writing when scoring the application. While scoring takes place in an open meeting, applicants will not be allowed to speak during the scoring process.

ASCOG AAA staff must be allowed to attend all project advisory council and board meetings, and report on any findings, resolved or unresolved.

This announcement is subject to change based on expected budget cuts. Some sites may no longer be funded.

If a nutrition site is defunded, transportation funding may be redirected to ensure the participants of the defunded site will be transported to the nearest active nutrition site.
