Every community should be communicating with their residents about the upcoming census. An accurate count is vital for each community because it helps determine where to locate schools. day-care centers, roads, public transportation, other hospitals, and facilities. Census information is used to determine grant eligibility criteria as well as determining the numbers for how many seats Oklahoma will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. It is used to determine what has to be done for redistricting of state legislators, county and city officials as well as voting districts. Each community should consider adopting a proclamation of commitment for a 2020 **CENSUS COMPLETE COUNT!** Be sure your community receives all of the benefits it deserves by encouraging everyone to provide accurate information to the census workers. 




REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING

This past year, the Southwest Oklahoma Regional Transportation Planning Organization (SORTPO) has formulated and completed long range plans for Grady and McClain Counties. Additionally, Jefferson, Stephens, and Tillman Counties have had updates made to their 2040 Long Range Transportation Plans. For Federal Fiscal Year 2019 long range plans are being researched and formulated for CADDO and COMANCHE COUNTIES. After these two counties' long-range plans are finished, then the sixteen county SORTPO Long Range Plan will formulated. This will become an invaluable tool to help develop a strong economic future for Southwest Oklahoma.

Once you are on the website, find Caddo or Comanche Counties and answer the survey. The information received from the survey will help determine where transportation funding will be focused. With \$60,000 from a 2018 REAP, the Town of Binger purchased the material to chip and seal several of their roads that needed repaired the most throughout their town. Portions of South 1st and South 2nd Streets, North 1st and North 2nd Streets, Caddo, Kiowa, Comanche, and Fairground Streets had worn to base material and was dusty when dry and messy when wet. Now those areas have newly surfaced roads that eliminated those problems. Caddo County Commissioner District #1 Benny Bowling and his crew provided the equipment and labor to install the material.
