REAP SPOTLIGHT PROJECT IS ON COMANCHE COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

Comanche County Commissioner Gail Turner sponsored a REAP grant application to purchase and equip and **Emergency Management Trailer.** The county requested a \$36,000 grant with a cash match leverage of \$9,000 from The trailer has been the County. completed including painting and detailing.

The trailer is to be used throughout the rural area of the county as needed. Whether requested by an agency such as a fire or police

department, or as deemed valuable by the **Comanche County Emergency Management office,** the trailer will serve as a portable command center from which the incident commander or chief can utilize its technology to better assess, respond, or recover from emergency situations. The trailer will be available for responses to wildfires, natural disasters, search and rescue, tactical rescue, civil disturbance, man-made attacks, etc.

The trailer will work out of the Comanche County Emergency Management office but is seen

as a huge resource for all of the county's and volunteer fire departments community police departments who would not otherwise have access to the equipment and technology available Congratulations to within the trailer. **Commissioner Turner and Emergency Management Director Michael Merritt for** their vision and hard work to make this needed asset a viable option and available when needed...

2020 CDBG GRANT APPLICATIONS

CDBG applications are up next. Please encourage entities in your area to start preparing and take appropriate action now if they intend to apply for a CDBG. We

always have some that will wait too late to get the required meetings and other actions completed. The public hearings must be advertised at least 7 days prior and then you must have a meeting to confirm what was done in the public hearing. Also, Low-to-Moderate Income (LMI) Surveys may be necessary to qualify. If federal funds are to be used for engineering, a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) process is mandatory.



Engineering plans and specifications take time, so you should be talking to engineers now. You **MUST HAVE YOUR 2019 AUDIT OR AGREED UPON PROCEDURES COMPLETED** and included with your application. If there are any questions, please contact CED Staff.

2020 CENSUS - GET 'EM COUNTED!



Every community should be communicating with their residents about the upcoming census. An accurate count is vital for each community because it helps determine where to locate schools, day-care centers, roads, public transportation, hospitals, and other facilities. Census information is used to determine grant eligibility criteria as

well as determining the numbers for how many seats Oklahoma will have in the U.S. House of Representatives. It is used to determine what has to be done for redistricting of state legislators, county and city officials as well as voting districts. Each community should consider adopting a proclamation of commitment for a 2020 CENSUS COMPLETE COUNT! Be sure your community


